




Indigenous traditions and culture is all around us and has been since time immemorial. All books listed are written by Indigenous authors.




Still This Love Goes On by Buffy Sainte-Marie Celebrate Indigenous traditions of honor, nature and community based Indigenous Cree knowledge.




Rock Your Mocs by Laurel Goodluck Celebrate the joy and power of wearing moccasins and the Native pride that comes with them.




A Day with Yayah by Nicola I. Campbell A grandmother passes on the knowledge of plants and the natural world to her grandchild.

Powwow Day by Traci Sorell Rivers want to dance the annual powwow, but this year an illness might keep her from dancing! Will River dance again?






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Young Water Protectors by Aslan Tudor Read about the inspiring experiences in the Oceti Sakowin Camp at Standing Rock.



History of the United States by Roxanne Dunbar-Ortiz The first history of the U.S. written from an Indigenous persepctive.




The Water Walker by Joanne Robertson The story of a determined Ojibwe Grandmother (Nokomis) and her great love for Nibi (water).


Dragonfly KITES Pimilhaagansa
